Safety Socket Statement on California Proposition 65

California Proposition 65 requires that a company give a “clear and reasonable warning” to individuals before “knowingly and intentionally” exposing them to chemicals enumerated in the Proposition unless the company can demonstrate that the exposure is so small that it presents “no significant risk” of cancer or “no observable effect” with regard to reproductive toxins. For many listed Proposition 65 chemicals, a California agency has determined “Safe Harbor” levels of exposure, below which no warning is required. The list of chemicals and other information regarding Proposition 65 can be found at www.oehha.ca.gov/prop65.
